Half Term Activities

Get splashing this half term!

Although many local paddling pools and splash pads aren't opening until later in the Summer there are plenty of places to get splashing locally this half term...



Coral Reef run their SEN Sessions throughout school Holidays – online booking: **here**.

Remember you can use your CAN card as proof of disability for the session, and to book your free carer ticket as applicable.

<u>Great Hollands recreation ground</u> and <u>Jocks Lane park</u> in Bracknell may open their splash pads in half term dependent on the weather – so watch the forecast!

The paddling pool at **Beale Wildlife Park** re-opened on 1st May! And they also have a new soft play area to explore. Find out more **here**.

Although <u>California Country Park's</u> paddling pool won't be open until the Summer holidays – the water play section of the playground is open for creative splashy play!

On the water activities at **Dinton Activity Centre** include boat hire – and remember your CAN Card offers 10% off pay and play boat hire – ring 0118 934 4424

More about Me2 Club

Does your child need help at a mainstream activity club?

Me2 Club is an inclusion charity for children and young people with additional needs and disabilities in the Wokingham and Reading Boroughs. Supporting children and young people aged 5-19 to take part in mainstream leisure activities by recruiting and training volunteers to 'buddy' 1:1 with them (2:1 when required) so they can join in and have fun and access a wide range of activities including sports clubs, uniformed groups and drama classes. No formal diagnosis required for support.

CAN Network News

The CAN Information Network is part of Wokingham Borough Council and is an information and support service for children, young people and young adults (up to age 25), and their families who live in the Wokingham Borough.

The way you apply for and renew your CAN Card has changed!

CAN card applications and renewals have now moved online.

Please visit <u>https://directory.wokingham.gov.uk/kb5/wokingham/directory/dcr.page</u> when you are ready to apply for a new card.

You will need to register for an account before you can start your application.

You will need to upload a recent photo of your child, and evidence of your child's disability – this can be a scan or a photo.

Types of evidence accepted

- Letter from health professional clearly stating diagnosed disability
- Education, Health & Care plan where diagnosed disability has been identified in writing

We will need this evidence for each renewal, as well as new applications.

Some useful links:

ASD Family Help Open to all autistic individuals or those with associated conditions. No diagnosis required. Connect with other autistic or neurodiverse adults or parents and carers at regular dropin sessions. Fun activities for children and teenagers, social groups for adults and outings for the whole family. Practical help and advice navigating diagnosis, education, benefits, or day to day life; via phone, email, or face-to-face meetings.

ASSIST (Autism Spectrum Service for Information Support and Training). ASSIST offer targeted help for Wokingham Borough families with a child or young person (up to 18) with a diagnosis of autism, or on the pathway for an autism assessment. Contact the team for information, advice, guidance and signposting in relation to autism. **Anyone** who has an interest in autism or feels that the strategies shared might be useful is welcome to attend an ASSIST autism focused workshop

Parenting Special Children - charity, set up to help other parents/carers navigate the world of SEND empowering families whose children/young people are neurodivergent and/or have special needs and/or disabilities including early life trauma.

<u>**Promise Inclusion</u>** - Activities and groups where children with learning disabilities and/or autism have the opportunity to feel included, empowered and amazing!</u>

- Activities where siblings can feel supported and have the chance to have fun.
- Helping adults with learning disabilities and/or autism learn new skills, become more independent and build self-esteem in a supportive environment.
- A community made of PINC staff and volunteers all with first-hand experience as Carers offering support, advice, empathy and respite to fellow carers.

Send Voices Wokingham - the independent parent carer forum for the Borough. It was set up to ensure that the families and carers of children and young people with Special Educational Needs and disabilities between 0-25 years of age in the Wokingham Borough, can have a voice and participate fully in the development of services.

The SEND Local Offer webpages tell you about local support for children and young people aged 0 to 25, with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and their families. Sign up to the <u>SEND</u> Local Offer newsletter for half-termly updates.

<u>Wokingham Carers Partnership</u> - A partnership of three commissioned local charities: Age UK Berkshire, Berkshire Youth and Promise Inclusion. Offering information, advice, and support to people throughout Wokingham who are caring for a child or adult family member, partner or friend.
