



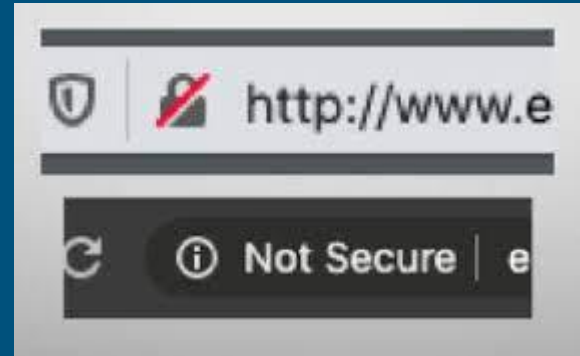
Online Safety

The padlock represents if the website is safe or not. When loading onto a website, make sure you check if there is a padlock locked before you continue onto that page.



Emails

Some people can get scam emails, they take your information and use it to buy stuff on websites that might not even be secure, make sure to delete those emails from your mail inbox.

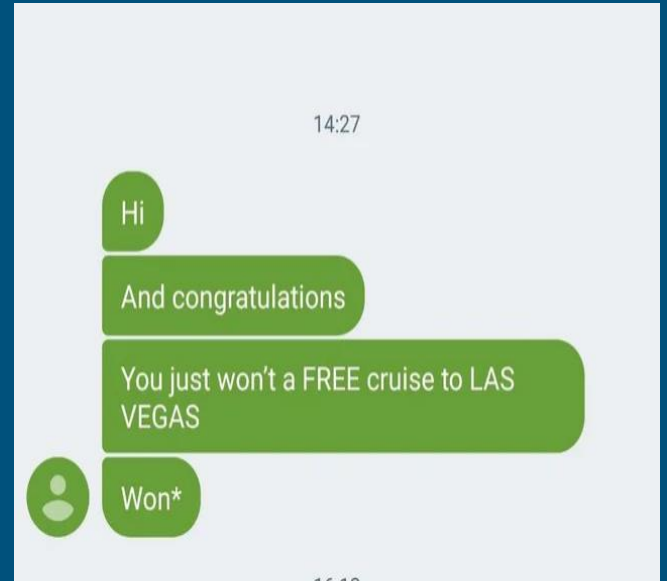

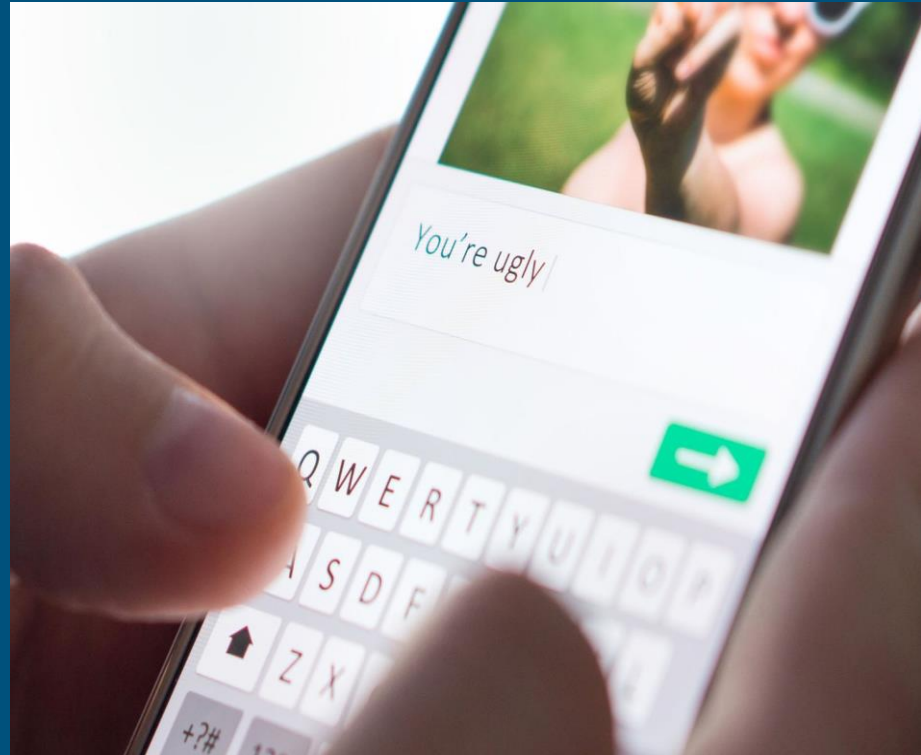
Scams
