Writing

Writing can sometimes be difficult to practice at home. However, try to encourage your child to write postcards in holidays, lists for shopping and letters to friends and family.

Give your child a simple sentence and see if they can improve it:

The boy went to the shops.

Quickly, the thirsty boy dashed to the local shops so that he could buy a drink.

We use cursive handwriting in school so this would be good to practice at home. Try forming the letters and then move on to writing simple words:

a b c d e f g h i j
k l m n o p q r s t
u v w x y z

Reading

In year 2, your child should be reading 5 times a week for at least 15 minutes. Listen to your child read and encourage them to sound out unfamiliar words. Discuss the book during and after reading. Here are some helpful questions:

What do you think might happen next? Why?

Can you describe the characters?

Which words are effective? Why?

What does the character's action tell us?

Do you know any similar stories?

What surprised you in the story?

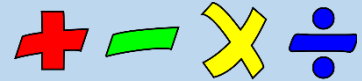

Maths



Maths can be practiced around the home, on the way to school or in the car. Here are a few suggestions of what to practice with your child:

- Count with money regularly
- Practice reading the time to 5 minute intervals
- Measure out ingredients and read scales
- Times tables - by the end of Year 2, they should know their 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 10s.
- Simple number bonds and addition and subtraction facts - practice quick recall of these so that they do not need fingers or a number line.
