<u>Arbor Parent Information -</u> <u>Communications</u>

When we communicate with you we use the following methods through Arbor:

- Email—We use email for our general messages
- In App message (you will only receive this if you have the app) - this type of message is usually sent if we want to send you something quickly.— if this message is not read the system will follow it up with an SMS. The delivery of the SMS can be anything from 1—24 hours after the In App message depending on message settings.
- SMS—We will send you a text message if we need to tell you something urgently.

All messages can be sent in the following ways:

- 1 message per recipient, regarding all students
- 1 message per recipient, regarding each student
- 1 message per household, regarding all students
- 1 message per household, regarding each student

The type of message and how many messages is normally dependant on the urgency and nature of the information.

In the news this week

A study from the University of Valencia, in Spain, found that print reading could boost skills by six to eight times more than digital reading, for example, on an e-reader or tablet. The study, published in the Review of Educational Research, also found that while there is a negative relationship between digital reading and comprehension for primary school pupils, the relationship turns positive for secondary school-aged pupils.
