### Collecting your children from school

Whilst we appreciate that traffic can sometimes be heavy and parents get stuck on the odd occasion, we are seeing more and more late pick-ups.

Unfortunately our staff finish at 3.30pm and we do NOT have the capacity to facilitate childcare in reception. Therefore going forwards if you are over 10 minutes late we will have to put your child in Afterschool club and you will be charged for half an hour (£3.50)

### Attendance and how it affects learning

At our recent parents coffee morning we discussed attendance and how it reflects on learning.

There are 365 days in a year, of which 190 are school days. This means that there are 175 days for family time.

Recent research by the Department for Education shows just how closely [attendance](#) and attainment are linked.

At primary school, children who attend nearly every day in Year 6 (95–100% attendance) have 30% higher odds of reaching the expected standard in reading, writing and maths compared to similar pupils who attend 90–95% of the time.
