World Book Day

Dress-Up Themes

The Importance of Arriving to School on Time

Arriving at school on time sets a positive tone for the whole day. When pupils start their morning promptly, they are ready to learn, organised, and able to take part in important routines such as registration, announcements, and the first lesson of the day. These early moments help children settle, focus, and feel prepared.

Being late, even by a few minutes, can cause disruption—not only for the pupil arriving late but also for the rest of the class. Lessons are often already underway, so a late arrival interrupts the flow of teaching and can make it harder for the late pupil to catch up. Over time, repeated lateness can affect learning progress, confidence, and a child's sense of belonging in the classroom.

By making punctuality a priority, we support a calm, consistent, and respectful learning environment for everyone. Thank you for helping us ensure that every day starts smoothly and positively for all our pupils.

Spring Term Parents Evenings

Parents' evening consultations are an essential part of supporting each child's learning. They provide a valuable opportunity for parents and teachers to talk together about progress, celebrate achievements, and discuss next steps. These conversations help ensure everyone is working in partnership, with a shared understanding of how best to support each child both in school and at home.
