Any pupil with less than 90% attendance is considered to be persistently absent.

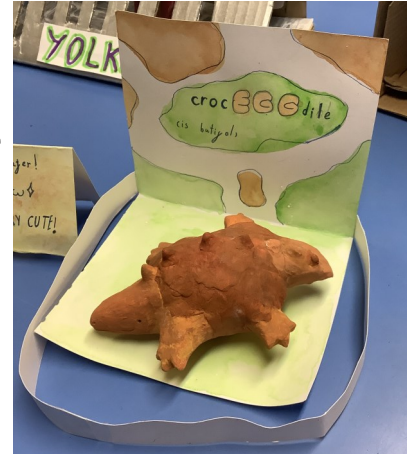

School provides a structured environment where children can learn, socialize and build

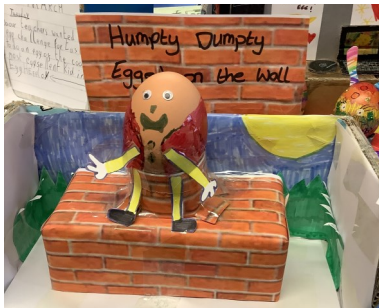


# **Egg-siting Easter Competition**
