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VOLUNTEERS NEEDED URGENTLY

Please be informed that the UK Health Security Agency has issued an **amber heat-health alert** for the South East, which covers Wokingham Borough. The alert is in effect from **11 July 2025 at 12:00pm to 14 July 2025 at 09:00am**.

As published on the [heat-health alert dashboard](#), this means that **significant** impacts are **likely** across health and social care services due to the high temperatures, including:

- a rise in deaths, particularly among those ages 65 and over or with health conditions. There may also be impacts on younger age groups
- likely increased demand on all health and social care services
- internal temperatures in care settings (hospitals and care homes) may exceed recommended threshold for clinical risk assessment
- the heat affecting the ability of the workforce to deliver services
- indoor environments overheating increasing the risk to vulnerable people living independently in community and care settings
- issues managing medicines
- staffing issues due to external factors (for example, affecting transport)

increased demand for power exceeding capacity

Other sectors may also start to observe impacts (for example, travel delays).

We recommend that colleagues take the following actions:

Implement the agreed processes in adverse weather plans and business continuity plans, as informed by the [action cards](#), [guidance](#) and other resources

- **Ensure appropriate actions** are taken by staff and services

Increase the volume of communications on how people can [Beat the Heat](#) – see below for links to more specific and detailed advice

Cascade this alert and information on how to reduce risks through your networks to staff, providers and partners to mobilise these plans
