Zebra Crossing

Definition and Purpose

A Zebra Crossing, also known as a marked Crosswalk, features broad white stripes the width of the road, resembling a pattern of a Zebra. These crossings are primarily intended to provide a safe passage for pedestrians, allowing them to cross the road with the right of way over vehicular traffic. The absence of traffic lights at Zebra Crossings means that drivers MUST be vigilant and prepared to stop when pedestrians are present.

We have had a few near misses this year on the crossing outside of the school. Please be mindful of the people crossing, it is their right of way.

PARKING

PLEASE DO NOT park in the school driveway and obstruct the gates. This is extremely dangerous.

Please do not also park on the zig zag lines.—
The approach to, and exit from, a pedestrian crossing is marked with zigzag lines. It also means that you must not park on them or overtake the leading vehicle when approaching the crossing. Parking here would block the view for pedestrians and the approaching traffic.

Personal E Scooters and the Law

We have been reliably informed by Thames Valley Police this week, that if a child is caught using an E Scooter anywhere **other** than private land, the E Scooter will be taken by the police. Because E Scooters can not be insured they are illegal for public use and therefore the confiscated scooter can not be returned.

Police have a responsibility to report parents who have allowed their child to illegally use E Scooters and this means that a report could be made to children's services.



What's the difference?

- Rental E-scooters.
- Zipp, Lime, Ginger, Tier & Voi are permitted by a government scheme to hire e-scooter's in cities and towns across the Thames Valley.
- Riders must hold a provisional or full drivers licence to hire these
- The rental company's will supply e-scooter motor vehicle insurance for riders.
- · These must be ridden on the road.
- Currently only in Buckinghamshire, Milton Keynes and Oxford.
- Although Slough were trialling the use of e-scooters, that trial is currently suspended.

- Personal E-scooters.
- These are for use on private land only.
- These are illegal on any public highway.
- You cannot get insurance to ride these on the road.

Summer water safety

Accidents are mostly preventable with the correct knowledge and judgment and here are our tips to staying safe in the water during the summer:

To enjoy the water safely and make the right call...

Enter slowly and carefully

Think carefully about your ability to splash or swim in cold outdoor water. 49% of those who lost their life were classified as swimmers*. Are you really a good swimmer?

Stay within reach

Don't go too far and stay within a standing depth.

Always be supervised

Over 70% of fatal accidents occur in the absence of professional supervision. Seek life guarded areas and always make sure some one is available to raise the alarm.

Summer is an amazing time to enjoy our beautiful waterways but we must be mindful that warmer weather is directly linked to an increase in fatal drowning incidents.

Rivers and Lakes/Lochs pose the greatest statistical risk as there are often hazards that the average person is equipped to handle and there is a lack of professional supervision.

In an emergency...

Call 999

If you are at the coast, call 999 and ask for the Coastguard. Don't enter the water to rescue.

 If you're in trouble FLOAT and call for help

Fall in or become tired – stay calm, float on your back and call for help. Throw something that floats to somebody that has fallen in.
