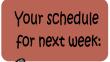


Attendance

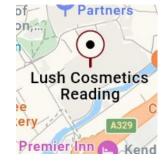












HOLLYWOOD DINER

Making Bath Bombs:

Step 1. Mixing a base of sodium bicarbonate with citric acid with fantastic fragrances and creative colours, as well as any luminous lustre if the mood calls for some sparkle.
