

Key Stage 2 SATs Results & Performance Tables 2019

During their final year at Primary school, Y6 pupils across the country take tests to assess how well they have performed against a national average and to measure their progress from KS1. These results are used to validate judgements about a school's success.

The tests assess pupils against a national standard for: Maths; Reading; Grammar, punctuation and spelling.

The following table shows National and Local Authority percentages for children reaching the expected standard in the tests, alongside those of Lambs Lane pupils.

A child's results in each test are reported using a scaled score. A scaled score of 100 represents the expected standard. If a child is awarded a scaled score of 100 or more, they are working at or above the expected standard in the subject. If a child gets a scaled score of less than 100 it means that they may need more support to reach the expected standard. The highest scaled score possible is 120, and the lowest is 80.
